





Toronto Arts Council (TAC) is the City of Toronto's funding body for artists and arts organizations. Since 1974, TAC has offered innovative and responsive programs, enabling artists and arts organizations to explore, create and thrive. With funding of nearly \$25 million annually, TAC grants lead to exhibitions, performances, readings and workshops seen each year by over five million people across the city. TAC is proud to play a leadership role in fostering Toronto's dynamic and diverse arts scene.

In 2016, Toronto Arts Council's strategic plan identified four strategic priorities that will guide TAC's operations through 2025:

- New investment that realizes the potential of Toronto's artists and arts organizations.
- Strong partnerships that extend opportunities, reach and profile of Toronto artists.
- Urban leadership that speaks with a compelling voice for a creative, equitable and thriving city.
- Responsive granting that reflects the city, embraces technology and builds on success.

TAC IMPACT BEYOND THE NUMBERS

Toronto Arts Council plays an essential role in sustaining and promoting Toronto's vibrant arts scene, and the numbers prove it. In 2022, we allocated 883 grants to arts organizations, collectives and individuals with a total value of \$23,586,808. Yet the numbers are only part of the picture. With each impact statistic and grant awarded, there are people involved. Toronto Arts Council's ecosystem is vast and dynamic. The next 12 pages offer just some of the people and stories behind the numbers.

2,014 APPLICATIONS RECEIVED

"In my role, I support different phases of the granting process. One of my daily tasks is to respond to questions about our grants from people with varying levels of familiarity with the application process. People are usually very appreciative of my help, which is nice. I also check submitted applications to make sure that the information we need is there and ensure the application and support materials can be accessed by our peer assessors. Putting a grant application together is an investment of time and energy, but it also gives the chance for applicants to reflect and organize their ideas. I see this as a positive thing."

65 DAYS OF ADJUDICATION

"With Theatre Projects panels, we always need two full days. This is because we typically receive 60-70 applications for each deadline. The peer assessors review and score the applications beforehand, but the majority of the decisions happen over the two days we meet. We discuss every application; there is a lot of value with what is said when we're together.

Among assessors, there are always differences in opinion, and that's what I encourage from the beginning. They do however, always evaluate projects following TAC's assessment criteria. In the end, we look at the average scores. Our process is very thoughtful and holds space for different opinions to come together -I've gotten this feedback from panel members - they love the system and trust it."

"As someone who has always tried to push Black creatives beyond the boundaries of what is expected of us, I smiled numerous times during this process as there were so very many projects that were doing just that. Animation, books, movies, sculpture, events, youth development, fashion, podcasts, fantasy, satire. Provocative. Visionary. Inventive. Exciting. The discussions we had were exciting and rejuvenating.

If I could, I would fund 70% of these projects. How do we encourage these artists not to quit on their great idea? How do we guide them to the pathways they need? Of course, there are limitations to what can be done with the funds available, but overall, I look forward to the blossoming renaissance in Black creativity."

43.8% APPLICATION SUCCESS RATE

"In 2020, our first Writers in Exile grant application to Toronto Arts Council was unsuccessful. In 2022, we were delighted to receive a TAC grant for the November Writers in Exile reading series our second event. As we moved forward with the TAC grant, we were able to learn, to improve and to make important professional changes. For example, we provided coaching sessions for the writers prior to their public presentation. Several of the writers had not presented their work in a public platform before and many struggled with English. These private coaching sessions were much appreciated."

"As Toronto's cost of living continues to soar, many artists are finding it increasingly difficult to remain in the city. To maintain a vibrant and inclusive creative community, it is crucial that arts funding is prioritized, and TAC has a vital role to play in this effort. Not only does funding support the development of new and innovative projects that challenge and inspire audiences in this city, but it also provides artists with opportunities to showcase their work on an international scale. In 2022, TAC awarded me project funding to create a new body of work which I exhibited in Istanbul in the fall. This same work will be featured in a group exhibition at The Power Plant in summer 2023. The support of TAC has been instrumental in furthering my artistic career and enabling me to continue calling Toronto home."

516 ORGANIZATIONS AND COLLECTIVES FUNDED

"Operating funding that you can count on allows you to invest in long term change, which is particularly important for Tangled Art's work, which straddles art and advocacy. It has allowed Tangled Art to establish itself as a site for political engagement and a place for us to create Disability culture.

It takes some time to create the space for emerging themes unique to Disability Arts to be advanced. Sustained funding is allowing us to make slower, but more important changes."
