

ACCESS TO THE ARTS Artists and arts organizations guide our work in many ways. Through Toronto Arts Council's peer assessment process, and the Foundation's relationships through programs like Arts in the Parks and the Neighbourhood Arts Network, we are always working together with artists. Their realities regularly inform our decision-making, enabling us to be responsive to and reflective of the communities we serve.

Everyone deserves to experience the transformative benefits of the arts. Through TAC's Artists in the Library, Animating Historic Sites and Animating Toronto Parks programs and the Foundation's Arts in the Parks program, we actively encourage no-cost arts programming in areas outside the downtown core. Our partnerships with Toronto Public Library, Toronto History Museums, Black Creek Pioneer Village and the City of Toronto's Parks, Forestry and Recreation department open public and city-owned spaces to artists and arts organizations to create and engage the public.

We are deeply committed to ensuring that our services are equitable

and accessible. TAC is guided by an Equity Framework and has developed

individuals and communities across Toronto.

CAREERS AND EMPLOYMENT

Toronto Arts Council and Foundation support livelihoods. Be it artists, arts workers or volunteers, both organizations invest in people and their careers. Many TAC grants support professional artists, while TAC Leaders Lab encourages professional development for arts leaders, the Newcomer & Refugee Artist Mentorship Program helps newcomer artists integrate and advance their practice through mentorship, and ArtReach funds youth artists and youth-led organizations with resources they need to reach their creative potential. The Foundation's Awards provide direct financial support for artists, arts leaders and arts organizations, while other programs such as Mentorin- Residence and ArtWorksTO provide mentorship and career-building opportunities for artists and youth media artists who are Indigenous, Black and People of Colour and/or 2SLGBTQ+.





Animating **Historic Sites** program

Biiskaabe Zaa'emaanag (Return of the Salmon) featured the creation of seven large-scale, illuminated salmon lanterns to highlight the significance of the return of Atlantic Salmon spawning migrations to Toronto waterways after their more than 100-year absence from the region. It was a collaborative learning project between lead artist Joseph Sagaj (Anishinaabe), Nokomis Rachel Shilling, Red Pepper Spectacle Arts and more, and was presented at Spadina House Museum.

Theatre **Projects program** Maanomaa, My Brother (My Bird, My Brother) tells the story of two men, childhood friends, who come together in Ghana to reconcile the events that separated their families 25 years earlier. The play was created by Tawiah M'Carthy and Brad Cook with Director Anne-Marie Donovan. It was produced by Blue Bird Theatre Collective and Co-Produced by Canadian Stage

Newcomer & Refugee Arts Engagement program

Picture This is a project that connected Thorncliffe Park newcomers to RV Burgess Park through land-based play approaches, exploring themes of identity and collective memory, and access to green spaces. It was presented by STEPS.

Through programs designed to support the artistic practice of creators, NAN contributes to a connected arts community that encourages the exchange of ideas, resources, and expertise between Toronto's artists, with a particular focus on increasing opportunities for youth, newcomer and refugee artists.



In August 2023, with additional support from Toronto Arts Foundation's Arts in the Parks program, House of Arts brought the vibrancy of their community outdoors through the Hear the Horn of East Africa Festival. "We wanted to bring a festival that reminds and connects our people to their ancestral deep rooted creative culture," Warda explained. "People need an entryway into our culture first, through dance, poetry, storytelling and fashion."

WARDA YOUSSOUF is a community builder. Originally from Djibouti, she was a refugee for 14 years before finding a home in Toronto. Since then, Warda has built a space for Toronto-based creatives through her grassroots collective House of Arts.

The House of Arts's newest project, an outdoor East African festival, was selected by a panel of artists and partners to receive funding from Toronto Arts Council's Animating Toronto Parks grant program. Through this funding, Warda engaged 20 artists in a project that showcased East African culture in an immersive and accessible way.



The celebration of East African culture took place at Guild Park and Gardens and featured performances and experiences ranging from henna stations and food vendors to dance performances and a fashion show. Toronto Arts Foundation's role through Arts in the Parks provided access to public space, permitting and staffing resources, as well as marketing and community outreach.

Bringing this celebration to Guild Park and Gardens fostered cultural exchange and embraced the beauty of diversity through art. The festival highlighted the shared belief of Toronto Arts Council and Foundation: that the creation and presentation of the arts should be accessible to all Torontonians.

Spotlight on TAC's Newcomer and Refugee Artist Mentorship program and the Foundation's mentor matching support

MAYTHAM JBARA arrived in Toronto in 2018 from Iraq, determined to produce work that would help open doors between Canada and the Middle East. Despite having extensive experience in the Middle Eastern film industry, Maytham faced significant barriers establishing himself in Canada. "I had to understand the rules, how people work," he explained. "There were things that I couldn't learn sitting at home. I needed to understand the specific things that could drop me into this industry, then I could take care of the rest."

Maytham found TAC's Newcomer & Refugee Artist Mentorship grant program, designed to help artists further their integration and inclusion to Toronto. With specific goals but no mentor in mind, he requested mentor matching support through the Foundation's Neighbourhood Arts Network.

Through the program, Maytham was introduced to Pakistani filmmaker Shehrezade Mian. Shehrezade's experience as an international liaison between Canadian and Pakistani productions perfectly supported Maytham's creative and career goals. Their first one-hour meeting quickly became four hours of goal setting and planning, and a match was made.

The pair's successful application in 2022 allowed them to develop a collaborative and supportive relationship over 2023 that focused on learning about film financing, distribution, production, networking, regulations and standard practices in Canada.

A lot has changed for Maytham since working with Shehrezade. He has worked on six feature films and continues to build creative bridges between Canada and Iraq. Hanging Gardens, one of the features that Maytham associate produced, was Iraq's 2024 submission for Best International Feature Film at the Academy Awards.

Following the end of the official mentorship, Shehrezade and Maytham remain friends, creative collaborators, and advocates for each other's work.

Maytham now sits on the panel for the Foundation's Newcomer Artist Award and is inspired to celebrate artists who he sees fighting for their careers and their creativity.

Through these programs and more, we're working on elements beyond the creation of art that support a healthy arts sector, recognizing that peer- to- peer knowledge sharing, networking and mentorship is essential to move art and people forward. A well supported arts sector is supported at every level, from administration and skills development to creation. Financial support for artists and arts organizations to create their work is an incredibly important piece of the puzzle, but so too is supporting the individual artists, arts workers, and board volunteers with administrative support, including grant writing and project consultation so that they can successfully achieve their goals.

The last several years have demanded a lot from artists, arts leaders and arts organizations. The restrictions of the pandemic brought the "how" of many artists' practices into question, while the global social and political climate put the "why" at the centre of artmaking with a renewed sense of urgency. The vitality of the arts in Toronto has relied, in part, on the strength of community and the well-being and capacity of our cultural leaders. Through several TAC and Foundation programs, we are supporting the pillars that contribute to a healthy arts ecology.

Toronto Arts Council's TAC Leaders Lab supports arts leaders through networking, workshops and learning intensives. Over the course of a year, the program aims to strengthen their capacity as leaders and help them collaborate and gain new ideas so that they can continue in the workforce and help their organizations thrive.



Building the capacity of individuals within organizations is a similar goal of the Foundation's Creative Champion's Network. Through standalone workshops covering topics including diversity, changing leadership and advocacy, we offer arts board volunteers a venue to learn how to become effective board members and meet like-minded volunteers, strengthening our sector's culture of support.

Mentor-in-Residence is a program of the Foundation's Neighbourhood Arts Network that connects artists and prospective grant applicants with industry experts to discuss ideas, grant program applications, accessibility in the arts, how to market yourself as an artist and more. A partnership quickly formed between this program and TAC's Black Arts grant program, giving prospective TAC grant applicants career-defining training and project support to encourage more applications and bold projects. The artist-to-artist and peer-to-peer forms of connection offered through these initiatives serve not only to combat isolation and burnout, but directly support artists in the fullfilment of their grant applications and projects.

Through these programs and more, we're working on elements beyond the creation of art that support a healthy arts sector, recognizing that peer- to-peer knowledge sharing, networking and mentorship is essential to move art and people forward.

Peer assessors are selected by TAC program managers based on the content and variety of the grant application pool. 
